The Community College of Baltimore County is pleased to provide the following information regarding our institution's graduation/completion and transfer-out rates. The information is provided in compliance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. The rates reflect the graduation, completion and transfer-out status of first-time, full-time degree/certificate-seeking students who enrolled during the **2017-2018** school year and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-completion has elapsed (e.g. three years from initial entry).

**While reviewing this information please bear in mind:**

- Graduation and transfer-out rates measured at three years from initial entry (this equates to 150% of normal time for a two year program).
- Transfers include Maryland and out-of-state.
